The International Registration Plan (IRP) is a registration reciprocity agreement among jurisdictions of the United States, the District of Columbia and provinces of Canada providing for payment of apportionable fees on the basis of total distance operated in all jurisdictions. IRP's fundamental principle is to promote and encourage the fullest possible use of the highway system.

Trucking Wages Continue to Rise Despite Challenging Freight Economy

On Tuesday, September 3, 2024, the American Trucking Associations released the results of its latest Driver Compensation Study showing that, despite a currently challenging freight market for motor carriers, driver wages across the industry continue to increase post-pandemic. The study provides detailed wage and benefit information for drivers based on a wide-ranging survey that collected data from 120 fleets, more than 150,000 employee drivers and 14,000 independent contractors.

The District of Columbia, like other IRP jurisdictions, is required to conduct vehicle audits to verify information about distance apportioned in each jurisdiction.

As a vehicle owner applying for registration under the IRP, you need to keep your records for at least three years after the registration year ends. These records should support the information you provided when applying for registration. If requested, you must be able to provide these records for an audit.
